IOC PRESIDENT

On Sunday 3 April, **IOC President Jacques Rogge** travelled to London (Great Britain) to attend the meetings held from 3 to 8 April as part of the SportAccord Convention, where the delegates included representatives of the International Sports Federations and organisations affiliated to SportAccord (General Association of International Sports Federations), ASOIF (Association of Summer Olympic International Federations) and AIOWF (Association of International Olympic Winter Federations).

On Monday evening, he attended the **SportAccord** opening ceremony, where he gave a speech.

On Tuesday and Wednesday, he took part in the meetings of the **Executive Board, which began with joint meetings with the summer and winter International Federations**. A press conference concluded the two days of discussions.

SUMMER IFS



The **International Gymnastics Federation (FIG)** and the gymnastics family worldwide are fully aware of the critical situation in Japan at the moment. On 24 March, Pierre-Olivier Beckers, President of the **Belgian NOC**, welcomed his Brazilian NOC counterpart, Carlos Arthur Nuzman, who was visiting Belgium in the context of the 2012 Olympic Games in London and the 2016 edition in Rio. The two NOCs signed a memorandum of understanding, agreeing in particular that Brazilian athletes would, in the short term, train in Belgium in preparation for the 2012 Games in London. In London on Tuesday, the **Brazilian NOC** signed two important sports cooperation agreements: the first with the International Hockey Federation (FIH) and the second with the British NOC (BOA).
